	The regulatory functions of the Authority include the following: Licensing and supervising all the capital market intermediaries; Ensuring proper conduct of all licensed persons and market institutions; Regulating the issuance of the capital market products; Promoting market development through research on new products and institutions; Promoting investor education and public awareness; and Protecting investors' interest.
